## Petition For Elks Charter To Be Closed Friday Night

A potition, asking for an Elks Lodge charter here will be closed at a meeting of prospective Elks to be held in the office of Mac Martin Friday night, W. S. Kitchen, secretary, has announced.

All persons wishing to be charter members of the new organization must make application for membership before the petition is completed, the secretary said.

Definite date for installation of the Lodge has not been set but it is expected to be held during the last part of October, Members from Lodges in Little Rock, Hot Springs, Texarkana, Brinkley, Jonesboro and other towns in Arkansas and Missouri will be present for the installation at which time the State Association will hold its regular meeting here. Among those expected to attend the installation will be John F. Faye of Hot Springs, Grand District Deputy; William Lauback, president of the state association and Brace Campbell, past Grand Exhalted Ruler of East St. Louis.

The petition asking for charter already has the alguntures of 42 prospective members and others are expected to make application for membership before the petition is closed, Mr. Kitchen said.
