## 20 Project Plans for Serving Veterans

**Please note**: These project ideas are not one-size-fits-all for CIP grants. Please read and understand the guidelines for each individual grant before applying.

- 1. Create Welcome Home Kits for veterans transitioning into permanent housing. View the in-depth project plan here.
- 2. Host a job fair for veterans where you provide a meal, interview clothes and a resume-writing workshop.
- 3. Run monthly social events or outings for a local VA facility.
- 4. Help build wheelchair ramps or make repairs to the homes of local veterans with disabilities.
- 5. Organize a family resources picnic for military families, including presentations on local veteran services.
- 6. Get involved with a local Stand Down by providing clothing, school and office supplies, hygiene items or haircuts. View the in-depth project plan <a href="here">here</a>.
- 7. Plan a recreation or outdoor excursion for veterans with disabilities.
- 8. Prepare and deliver warm meals to veterans who are homeless or homebound.
- 9. Recruit volunteers to enhance the facilities of a veterans' transitional housing complex. View the in-depth project plan here.
- 10. Host art or music therapy at the Lodge, complete with an exhibit or concert.
- 11. Provide transportation to VA hospitals or medical appointments.
- 12. Present a mental health first aid course geared towards veterans.
- 13. Partner with a therapy dog organization or animal shelter to host an adoption day. - 14. Host a baby shower for female veterans or expecting military families in need of resources.
- 15. Assist veterans in creating personal video histories and share the edited results at an evening presentation with their families.
- 16. Organize a back-to-school drive to distribute backpacks and school supplies to children from military families.
- 17. Start a monthly visit to veterans at a local senior center, and bring hygiene supplies, clothes and other needed items.
- 18. Partner with local service organizations to provide support to families of those who are deployed.
- 19. Deliver entertainment and comfort items to veterans who are hospitalized.
- 20. Start a support group for veterans who are transitioning from active duty.
