B asketballs bouncing. Hearts pounding. Fans watching with bated breath. The tension at the 2024 Elks Hoop Shoot National Finals was palpable, but for the 72 National Finalists, it was all just noise—or perhaps, a lack thereof.

From April 18 to 21, Hoop Shoot National Finalists, their families, and Elks traveled to Chicago for a weekend that was far more than just a free throw contest. Though the National Finalists knew they had to compete on Saturday, that didn't stop them from making friends and enjoying one another's company.

"I think it's a good experience for everybody," says Rylan Buhr, a National Finalist sponsored by Sheboygan, Wis., Lodge No. 299. "You get to meet different ages, people from everywhere. And it's fun, super fun."

Competitors swapped personalized trading cards, attended family-friendly trivia and movie nights, and even went to historic Wrigley Field for a Cubs game.

"Most people, they don't get to do this much stuff," says Caroline Kooman, a National Finalist sponsored by Northglenn, Colo., Lodge No. 2438. "It's really fun to get these experiences."



SEPTEMBER 1: 2025 Legacy Awards Application Launch The free throw line is a familiar place for every National Finalist, but in a new environment, even the most familiar place can feel foreign. Friday morning, competitors got the chance to shake off the rust and get re-acquainted with the free throw line at the practice gym. The competitors weren't the only ones shaking off the rust, though—members of the Hoop Shoot Alumni Advisory Board, aka the BackBoard, prepared for their role in the contest by catching the shots that were made or chasing down the shots that were missed. With the amount of practice the National Finalists put in, it's safe to say the BackBoard did not have to do much chasing.

Then, it was time for the contest.

As the first Finalists stepped up to the line at Wintrust Arena, home of the WNBA Chicago Sky and DePaul Blue Demons, the 10,000-seat arena was silent, outside of the occasional bouncing ball or pounding heart. With all eyes on them, six competitors were able to dig deep, unleash their grit, and rise above the rest.

In the 8-9 divisions, both Ainsley Weaver, sponsored by Chillicothe, Ohio, Lodge No. 52, and Parker Moeller, sponsored by Mercer County, Ohio, Lodge No. 2170, won their Frank Hise National Championships in shootoffs, after sinking 24 free throws in regulation.

No shootoffs were needed in the 10-11 divisions, however. Beckett Jilka, sponsored by Hoxie, Kan., Lodge No. 2415, posted the only perfect score of the day en route to his national title, while Blake Ensfield, sponsored by South Haven, Mich., Lodge No. 1509, ran away with the girls' contest by hitting 24 free throws.

The 12-13 divisions must have enjoyed the drama earlier in the day, because they also required shootoffs to resolve. Ayden Birch, sponsored by Midwest City, Okla., Lodge No. 1890, and Ava Cumicek, sponsored by Green Bay, Wis., Lodge No. 259, stepped up to the line, ignored the pressure, and became the final Frank Hise National Champions of the day.

Though all the National Champions had been

determined, there was still one title to award: the girls Getty Powell Award winner. Because Ainsley and Blake both sank 24 shots in regulation, one more shootoff was required to determine the overall winner. With all eyes on her

Please join us in honoring the 2024 Elks Hoop Shoot Hall of Fame inductees: Competitors David Sickler and Maggie Goltz, and Contributors Jud and Deb Good.

The Goods served as the Regional Director team for Region 11 for 11 years. Their journey with the Hoop Shoot started long before they became a Regional Director duo.

"Jud has always had a love of sports and a love for what sports can mean in a person's life," says Vern Larson, former director of Region 2, who served in the position for 26 years. "When he was told about the Hoop Shoot,

once again, the 9-year-old Weaver drained all 10 of her extra shots and joined Jilka as the other Getty Powell Award winner.

After a long day of free throws, the National Finalists were honored at the Awards Banquet. While the newly crowned national champions were celebrating, those who came up short likely felt some sense of sadness—but they weren't alone. Keynote speaker and head coach of the Northwestern University Men's Basketball team, Chris Collins, shared that same feeling when he came in fourth place at the 1984 Hoop Shoot National Finals.

"I'm 50 years old now, and I competed in this when I was a 9-year-old kid," said Collins. "Coming in here brought back memories of all the times I practiced, all the competitions I went through, and coming up short in the National Finals."

Though Collins didn't achieve his goal, he picked himself up, went back to work, and achieved greatness.

"For all of you going forward," Collins said, "I hope this has shown you that when you put your mind to something, you can be great in whatever it is. I was a kid who wanted to be great—and now here I am."

Whether they achieved their goal or not, the 72 National Finalists all have what it takes to be great—and should walk away feeling like champions.

The senior spring semester of high school brings a wide range of emotions: excitement, relief, sadness, fear. No matter how prepared one may feel for the next stage of life, a strong support system is important to help cope with these feelings.

An Elks scholarship is more than financial aid; it's an invitation to join a strong, supportive community: the #ElksFamily. The Top 20 Most Valuable Student scholars got to experience this community firsthand in April, when they came to Chicago for the 2024 MVS Leadership Weekend. Though they were only together for three days, the Top 20 left Chicago with more than just memories.

"The Leadership Weekend taught me that the Elks are not just an organization, but they are family," says Rohil Agarwal, sponsored by New Port Richey, Fla., Lodge No. 2284. "I constantly felt welcomed and inspired by the Elks team, the scholar leaders, and the other 2024 Elks MVS Finalists."

After an opening night that included warm welcomes at the airport, initial icebreakers, and a competitive game of trivia, the scholars began their first full day of the weekend with a visit to the Elks National Veterans Memorial and Headquarters. The scholars' jaws dropped when they saw the ornate beauty and detail of the nearly 100-year-old building.

Once the initial shock dissipated, the scholars explored the building with a scavenger hunt and listened to presentations about the Community Investments Program, the Elks Hoop Shoot, and the Elks National Veterans Service Commission.

"I really enjoyed learning more about the ENF at the Elks National Veterans Memorial," says Leslie Monter, sponsored by Easton, Md., Lodge No. 1622. "Prior to the MVS Leadership Weekend, I had very basic knowledge regarding the Elks and their mission; the scavenger hunt was a great way to learn about the rich history of the Elks."

After visiting the Memorial, the scholars partook in another Elks' tradition: service.

the first thing he did was put together the first shoot for the Plano Elks Lodge. It was a small but great beginning."



CONTINUING THE LEGACY

n April, 350 high school seniors received Legacy Awards scholarships, which are available to the children and grandchildren of Elks.

"Receiving an Elks Legacy scholarship is a profound honor that represents not only financial support but also recognition of my family connection to the Elks community," says Denton Wiggins, a Legacy scholar sponsored by Perry, Fla., Lodge No. 1851. "It signifies a legacy of service, generosity, and commitment to education passed down through generations."

Legacy Awards recipients receive \$4,000 scholarships, and they are required to serve with

The scholars exemplified Elks values through their service, as well. On the trip, they served with three different organizations: Cradles to Crayons, which addresses clothing insecurity; Urban Growers Collective, which fights food insecurity; and the Lincoln Park Conservancy, which promotes environmentalism.

"The Chicago Service Trip was an amazing opportunity to meet other Elks scholars and volunteer with different organizations," says Angelina Lovato, a 2022 Legacy Awards recipient from Westminster, Colo., Lodge No. 2227. "Volunteering alongside other Elk scholars with these various organizations made our impact feel so much more meaningful. It was such a cool experience."

The scholars also visited the Elks National Veterans Memorial and Headquarters, where they learned about the history of the Elks. This visit gave the scholars the opportunity to connect their scholarships to the broader work of the Elks and Elks National Foundation. Many of them realized that their scholarships are so much more than just a check—they are an invitation to be part of the #ElksFamily.

So why do our scholars serve? Are they actually able to make a difference in only a few days?

The differences they made through sorting clothes, preparing soil beds for crops, and cleaning the park will be felt by the Chicagoland area, but the differences in their own lives will be even more impactful. After such an incredible week, the scholars are left with something that will last far beyond next season's crops: community.

The Elks National Foundation offers three Elks Scholar Service Trips annually. These trips provide scholars the opportunity to learn about societal issues, serve those in need in the name of the Elks, and connect with their #ElksFamily from across the country. A Hello Skeptical,

Believe it or not, it is true! Each year, the ENF strives to grant more money back to each state than it received from that state in donations. These grants help fund the state Elks associations' major charitable projects, which include aid for people with disabilities, cancer research, children's hospitals, youth camps, and safe havens for abused families. The state associations also use these grants to fund their Hoop Shoot, Soccer Shoot, Drug Awareness, scholarship and veterans service programs, as well as other charitable and philanthropic projects.
