- provide for its government;

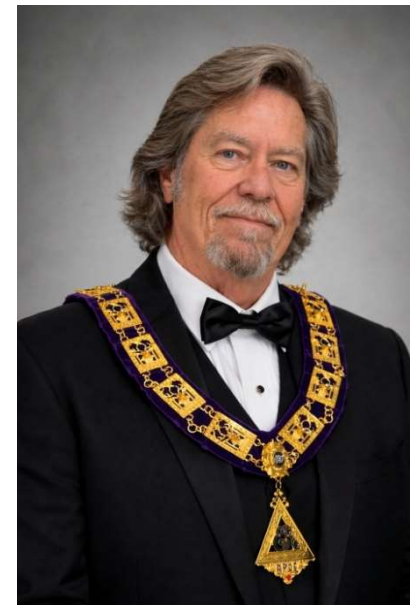
The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America will serve the people and communities around us through benevolent programs, demonstrating that Elks Care and Elks Share.

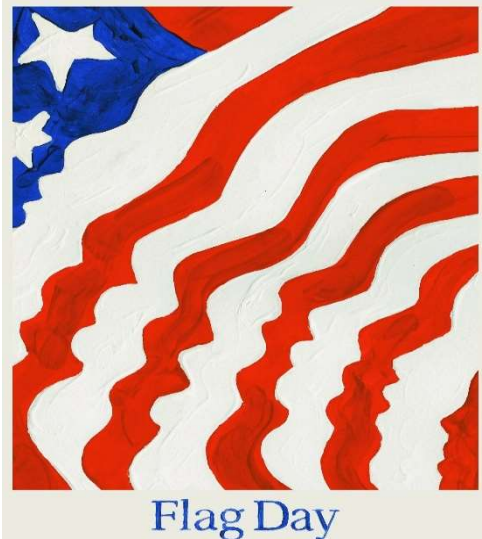

The Prescott Valley Civic Center, Theater On The Green will be the location of our Flag Day Ceremony. Starting at 11:00AM, this event is open to the public and all are encouraged to attend. Our annual Flag Day ceremony is perhaps the most visible connection between the Elks and the flag. Long before it became a national observance, the Elks were the first fraternal organization to formally celebrate Flag Day. During the Elks' Flag Day ritual, we recount the history of the flag's design and meaning, honor those who have served under it, and reaffirm our own duty as citizens. The ceremony is both solemn and uplifting. It is a blend of history, reflection, and promise to uphold the values embodied in the Stars and Stripes.

As Elks, the American flag is not simply a national emblem — it holds a place of deep reverence — it is a living symbol of unity, freedom, and the shared ideals that bind Americans together. Our organization's rituals, traditions, and community service all reflect profound respect for the flag and what it represents. As the nation healed from the Civil War, our founding Elks saw the need for civic service and unity under the flag. They made our flag the symbol of charity, one of our four cardinal virtues. With this visible reminder of national purpose and moral duty, every Elks Lodge prominently displays our flag. It is saluted at each gathering. The flag is treated with the same honor afforded a sacred trust — raised and lowered properly, never left neglected, and is always emblematic of American ideals of liberty and equality.

Our Americanism Committee will be out and about in the community, recognizing our neighbors for their display of Americanism, through their properly displayed and lighted Flags. 

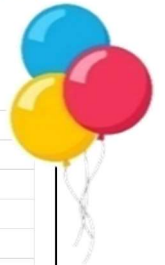
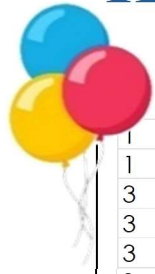
