### Get Involved - Make a Difference






# ELKS FOR VETERANS



They are fathers and mothers, sisters and brothers, neighbors and

friends. They are business owners, teachers, volunteers, and leaders in our communities. "Our dedication to our veterans stands as a reminder that service to others does not end with the uniform; it continues."





With that in mind, the Riverside Elks Veterans Committee has been busy supporting our local veterans and planning events to honor their service. Here's a look at what we've been working on and what's coming.

- Pantry Support: Over the summer, our committee delivered much needed supplies to US Vets March Veterans Village, helping restock their pantry during a time when resources were running low. The veterans expressed deep gratitude for the support.
- Personal Essentials: In September (pictured above), we shifted our focus to basic necessities.
  With the help of a Focus Grant, the committee purchased 250 T-shirts and 120 underwear for
  distribution. Samples of both men's and women's items were reviewed and approved by the
  committee. These items will make a real difference in the daily comfort of veterans at March
  Veterans Village.
- Looking Ahead: Our committee is preparing for a busy fall season with a Veterans Day Celebration, and Holiday Giving.

October is Drug Awareness Month! October was first declared as National Substance Abuse Prevention Month in 2011. Since then, October has been a time to highlight the vital role of substance abuse prevention in both individual and community health, to remember those who have lost their lives to substance abuse, to acknowledge those in recovery, as well as children, parents, family, and friends supporting them. Studies show that the earlier an individual starts smoking, drinking, or using other drugs, the greater the likelihood of developing addiction. 9 out of 10 people who abuse or are addicted to nicotine, alcohol, or other drugs began using these substances before they were 18.

I would like to thank my new committee members (Marilyn Stadler, Michelle & David Survillas, Patti O'Donnell, Evelyn Eckroth & Susan Straight) for coming together as a team to assist with dictionaries and contest packets at our September meeting.
