## **SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Elks National Foundation began awarding scholarships to deserving students with high academics, financial need and service-oriented activities in 1931, and the Riverside Lodge 643 continues that tradition. The ENF awards six students in the Most Valuable Scholar awards – three for boys, three for girls. The applications are completed online; a high school counselor must assist in the process; grade transcripts are provided. There are five categories for judging: Academics and Financial Need, both of which are scored by the ENF in Chicago; our committee judged Community Service, Extracurricular Activities, Honors and

Awards at the National, Regional, and School level; Employment, and the Essay on a topic chosen by the ENF. The points are entered into the ENF MVS portal, and the awards are announced with notification coming via email to students.

When I became Chair, our lodge averaged 50 applications, and only six awards were given, in 2020. Three years ago, my fellow judge Carol Tong and I spoke to Josie White, who went to the Governing Body, with the idea that so many promising students, many with financial need, were just under the point totals of the top awards. The Governing Body was generous in the decision to add one Honorable Mention Award in 2021, for \$500, which was given to the next top student. In 2023, we were able to increase to six winners, for \$500 each, and we named those awards "Honorable Mention/Lodge Award, as we are proud of our lodge generosity.

In 2024, we had ten Lodge Award winners. This year, 2025, again due to the generosity of the Governing Board and Josie White, we will have twelve Lodge Awards, for \$1,500 each. All of those students submitted applications to the ENF Most Valuable Scholar competition, in Chicago. The top score is 1,000 points. Our top winner was a student with 967 points, and the Lodge Award winners scored from 937-855, the most competitive year we've ever had.

We look forward to the Youth Awards Banquet, which is always fantastic, and we hope to see you there to applaud our scholarship winners. Thanks to Evelyn Eckroth and all the lodge members who work so hard to make the night special for our students and families.

#### RECIPE OF THE MONTH

#### Mexican Street Corn Salad with Avocado

- 4 ears fresh corn, kernels cut from cob (4 cups)
- 1 1/2 Tbsp vegetable oil
- Salt 1/3 cup chopped red onion (run under water and drain to remove harsh bite)
- 1/3 cup slightly packed cilantro leaves, chopped
- 1 jalapeno pepper, stemmed, seeded and minced (optional)
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 3 oz Cotija cheese, finely crumbled
- 3 Tbsp mayonnaise (light or regular)
- 1 1/2 Tbsp fresh lime juice
- 1/2 tsp chili powder, then more to taste
- 1 1/2 medium avocados (semi-firm but ripe) chopped

#### Instructions

Heat vegetable oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat until shimmering.

Add corn, season with salt to taste and toss, then let cook, tossing only occasionally (about every 2 minutes) until corn is well charred all over (about 6 - 9 minutes total).

Remove from heat and allow to cool slightly.

Add corn to a medium bowl along with remaining ingredients. Toss.

Serve immediately with more chili powder to taste as desired.
