Drug Awareness News



Happy August!

It is so hard to believe that we are already more than halfway through the year. I am baffled at where the time goes.

I wanted to share a quick update from the Drug Awareness Program. This month, we are meeting with the St. George Drug Unit to discuss additional ways we can continue building our relationship with them, as well as walk through nominations for the annual award. They have expressed how excited they are to be part of that each year and how grateful they are for our partnership. They are already thinking through who would be a great fit for this year's nomination.

We also received this year's theme for the poster, essay, and video contest: "A Healthy Me is Drug Free."

The purpose of these contests is to involve children, schools, and parents in the Elks Drug Awareness Program, create opportunities for state Drug Awareness Programs to gain national recognition, and bring positive publicity to local lodges and state associations. Posters may also be used in the DAP coloring book, the national essay winner may be featured in the coloring book and on the website, and national video winners may be featured on the Drug Awareness Committee website.



Participation is generally broken out as follows:

Poster contest: grades 3-5

Essay contest: grades 6-8

Video contest: two age groups, pre-high school and high school. Posters and essays should be completed on standard 8.5 x 11 paper and should include the anti-drug abuse message/theme.

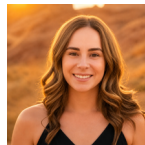
Essays should be no more than 200 words and may be handwritten, typed, or printed. Videos should be between 1 and 5 minutes long and should also include the theme. With the exception of Elroy, submissions should not include copyrighted characters or trademarks.

Each submission will need to include the student's name, the sponsoring lodge name and number, and the required parental release or hold harmless waiver. Students should also be informed that submitted posters, essays, and videos become the property of the BPOE and may be used on websites or social media.

We are already working with the local schools to help get the word out.

Thank you to everyone who has reached out asking how you can help. I have been keeping your information and will be reaching back out as fall gets closer, when we ramp up with the schools and community.

Enjoy the last bit of summer, and good luck surviving this heat!
