Proposed Amendments To The By-Laws

The following proposed amendments were read at the regular Lodge meeting held on Thursday, August 13th, 2026, at 7:00pm. The vote to approve these changes will take place at the regular Lodge meeting on Thursday, October 8th, 2026, at 7:00pm. If you wish to vote, please bring your signed membership card for identification purposes and attend the meeting.

ARTICLE IV, SECTION 1: MEETINGS

Current Language – The regular Lodge meetings of this lodge shall be held on the second and fourth Thursday of each month throughout the year, except in the months of November and December, in which the Lodge shall meet on the second Thursday.

Proposed Language - The regular Lodge meetings of this lodge shall be held on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month throughout the year, except in the months of November and December, in which the Lodge shall meet only on the second Tuesday.

ARTICLE V, SECTION 4, PARAGRAPH 7: ELECTIVE OFFICERS AND DUTIES

OF THE SECRETARY

Current Language – For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation \$5,400.00 per annum, payable monthly.

Proposed Language – For the faithful performance of his/her duties, the secretary shall receive \$12 per member, per annum (calculate by the ending membership of the preceding year), payable monthly.

ARTICLE V, SECTION 5 PARAGRAPH 1: ELECTIVE OFFICERS AND DUTIES

OF THE TREASURER

Current Language – He shall be required to give bond to the Lodge in the sum of \$5,000.00 for the faithful performance of his duties, and shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of \$3,000.00 per annum, payable monthly.

Proposed Language - He shall be required to give bond to the Lodge in the sum of \$5,000.00 for the faithful performance of his/her duties, the treasurer shall receive \$12 per member, per annum (calculate by the ending membership of the preceding year), payable monthly.

ARTICLE IX, SECTION 1: CLUB OPERATIONS AND MANAGEMENT

Current Language – A House Committee consisting of five members to be appointed by the Exalted Ruler.

Proposed Language - A House Committee consisting of seven members to be appointed by the Exalted Ruler.

ARTICLE X, SECTION 2: FEES AND DUES

(b) REGULAR LODGE DUES

Current Language – The regular Lodge dues shall be \$100.00 per year, which shall not include the Grand Lodge per capita fee, the Grand Lodge per capita insurance assessment, nor State Association dues.

Proposed Language - The regular Lodge dues shall be \$200.00 per year, which shall not include the Grand Lodge per capita fee, the Grand Lodge per capita insurance assessment, nor State Association dues.

Preserving Elks Lodge 1879 for the Future

Message to Members

Many of us have spent years, and in some cases decades, enjoying and supporting Elks Lodge 1879. This Lodge has provided friendships, memories, service opportunities, and a place we are proud to call our own. The proposed by-law changes are intended to ensure the Lodge remains strong and financially stable for future generations. We have not increased local dues in 10 years, and these changes are designed to provide a stronger foundation for the Lodge while allowing fundraising efforts to remain focused on charitable and benevolent purposes.

What Happens If We Do Nothing?

- The financial pressures facing the Lodge will continue.
- Future boards may have fewer options available to address Lodge needs and maintain the quality of the facility members enjoy today.
- Repairs and improvements may need to be delayed or postponed.
- Fundraising efforts may continue to be used for Lodge needs instead of charitable and benevolent purposes.
- The responsibility for maintaining the Lodge may increasingly fall on a smaller number of volunteers and donors.
- The goal of these proposals is to address challenges now rather than leave larger decisions to future members.

Monthly Meetings

Move meetings from the 2nd and 4th Thursday to the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month. Lodge procedures remain unchanged.

Secretary and Treasurer Compensation

Compensation for each position will be equal and calculated annually using active membership multiplied by \$12.

House Committee

Increase House Committee positions from 5 to 7 members.

Annual Local Lodge Dues

Increase local dues by \$100 annually. The total local dues will be \$200 annually.

*(This does **not include** the yearly applicable Grand Lodge and State fees).*

Closing Thought: These proposals are not about changing what makes our Lodge special. They are about preserving it. The members before us invested in this Lodge so we could enjoy it today. These changes are intended to help ensure that future generations can do the same.

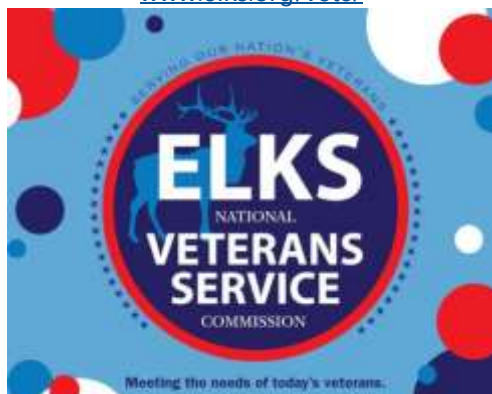

Member Recipe Blog

I would love to share the recipe for the **Cheesy Tater Casserole** that we all enjoyed with our Seafood Platter back in August! My favorite potato for this dish is **Yukon Gold**—and I **do not peel them!** I love the flavor and texture the skins add. And since I'm sharing the recipe, I might as well let you in on a couple of my little "secret" additions. A **wee bit of Lawry's Seasoned Salt** never hurts a dish like this, and a **pinch or two of sugar** is always another good idea! Hope you enjoy making it at home as much as we enjoyed serving it!

Cheesy Yukon Gold Potato Casserole

READY-TO-BAKE • Makes one 9 × 13-inch casserole

Potatoes	Oven	Bake Time
3 lb Yukon Gold	350°F	40–50 minutes

INGREDIENTS

- 3 lb Yukon Gold potatoes
- 5 Tbsp butter
- ½ large onion, finely diced
- 1¼ cups sour cream
- ■ can cream of chicken soup (about 7 oz)
- ■ can cream of mushroom soup (about 7 oz), or additional cream of chicken
- 2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese, divided
- ¾ tsp garlic powder
- ¾ tsp onion powder
- Salt and black pepper, to taste
- ¾ cup crushed cornflakes or buttery crackers
- 2 Tbsp melted butter, for topping

PREPARE THE POTATOES

Preheat oven to **350°F**. Dice potatoes into approximately ½-inch cubes. Place in boiling salted water and cook for **7–10 minutes**, until just barely fork-tender. Do not fully cook them; they will finish in the oven. Drain very well.

ASSEMBLE

Combine the 5 Tbsp butter, onion, sour cream, soups, garlic powder, onion powder, salt, pepper, and **1½ cups cheddar cheese**. Gently fold in the warm drained potatoes. Spread evenly in a greased 9 × 13-inch baking dish and sprinkle with the remaining **½ cup cheddar**.

ADD THE TOPPING

Mix the crushed cornflakes or crackers with **2 Tbsp melted butter**. Sprinkle evenly over the casserole.

BAKE

Bake uncovered at **350°F for 40–50 minutes**, until bubbling around the edges, the potatoes are tender, and the topping is golden brown. Let stand **5–10 minutes** before serving.

MAKE-AHEAD OPTION: Assemble earlier in the day, cover, and refrigerate. Wait to add the crunchy topping until just before baking. A refrigerated casserole may need an additional **10–15 minutes** in the oven.
