- 14. All properties of the Lounge and Lodge will remain on the premises UNLESS permission for removal is first granted by the Board of Directors of the Lodge. Members will be charged for property lost or destroyed by them or their guests.
- 15. Section 16.041, Statutes of the Order, authorizes action to be taken to disenfranchise a member from the Lounge for violation of House Rules. It is the duty of the House Committee to initiate such action upon observance of any willful violation of those rules. It shall be considered "conduct unbecoming an Elk" for a member to park in a Lodge handicapped parking space without prominent display on the member's vehicle, of a bona fide handicapped parking permit. It shall be incumbent upon a member hosting guests, who have vehicles parked at the Lodge, to ensure that said guests also respect the purpose of the parking spaces. It shall likewise be considered "conduct unbecoming an Elk" for any member to utilize a handicapped parking permit for parking at this Lodge under false pretenses. "Conduct unbecoming an Elk" is further defined in the Statutes of the Order.
- 16. The Lounge is authorized to sell and serve alcoholic beverages under permit from the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, and is therefore mandated to comply with the statutes, rules, and regulations of the Commission. Nothing herein published, or presumed due to omission should be construed to take precedence over TABC Regulations, and should conflicts arise, the TABC regulations shall prevail.

# Pre-register and acquire badges for convention

Pre-registration for the Austin Grand Lodge Convention is available at elks.org/convention/prereg.cfm through June 26.

The online pre-registration fee is \$50 for all Members, while the onsite registration fee will be \$60. A current credit card for PayPal will be needed. There is no fee for a non-Elk spouse or guest.

On-site registration will open on Friday, June 28, from noon to 4 p.m. When you arrive at the Austin Convention Center, go to the designated pre-registration line in the Registration area. You will need your e-mail confirmation and current membership card to receive credentials (and voting credentials, if qualified) for you and your spouse or guest. A registration badge will be required to enter the exhibit hall and all business sessions.

All non-Elk guests, including widows and widowers of Elks, must register at the Guest Registration Station at the convention center to obtain registration badges. Guests need a badge to enter the exhibit hall, see the Installation of Grand Lodge Officers, or attend any other events where they are permitted. Be advised exhibits and vendors will not open until 8:00 a.m. Saturday.

Grand Lodge registration and its required fee are not included in any State Association's "package" arrangement.



### Do more for veterans with boosted Welcome Home Kit

When a veteran becomes housed it is a joyous occasion, but it is not the end of the story. Rather, it signifies a new beginning.

Many veterans need help getting off to a strong start, and that is where the Elks come in. Veterans frequently enter permanent housing directly from shelters and may have no belongings other than the clothes on their backs. As we all know, a home is more than just four walls and a roof.

Through the Welcome Home Kit program, Elks help veterans around the country feel at home in their new residences.

And soon, Lodges will be able to do even more for veterans exiting homelessness. Starting April 1, Lodges will be able to apply for up to \$400 per kit, an increase from \$300 per kit last year. \*\* Also, Lodges can still apply for up to \$600 for each kit that includes a bed. These extra funds can mean a big difference for veterans and their families.

Every veteran has their own story as to how they became homeless. Similarly, every veteran has unique hopes and dreams. A stable home provides security and can be the first step for veterans to achieve bright futures.

Thanks to the dedication of Elks far and wide, the Welcome Home Kit program recently surpassed 12,000 total veterans served with this program! All Lodges are eligible to participate, and with your help, the upcoming year can be our biggest yet.
