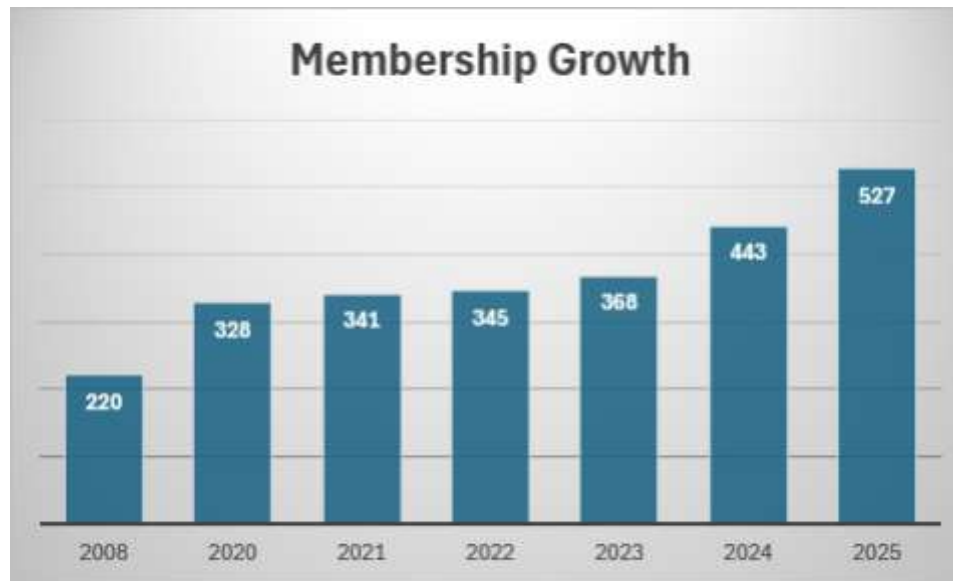

2024 - 2025 YEAR IN REVIEW



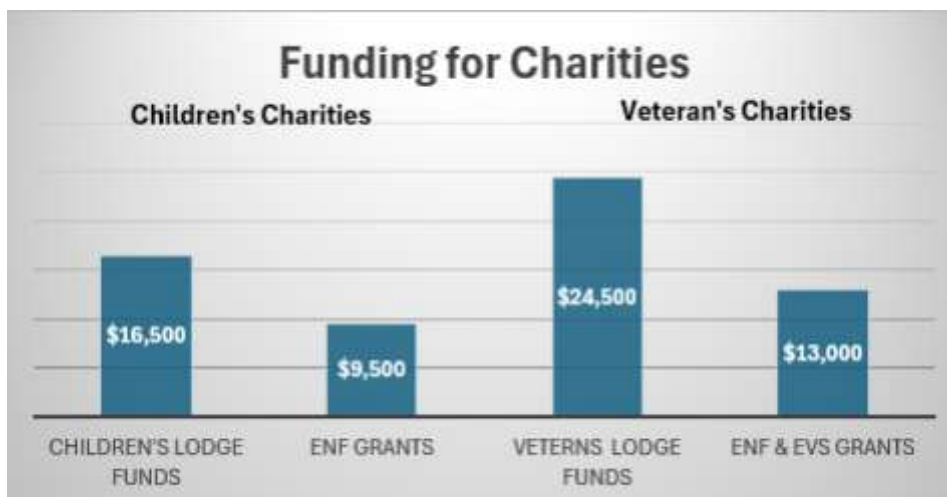
Membership Growth

Arizona Elks Association (AEA) Bylaws Proposed Changes

At our Lodge Meeting on April 1, 2025, we will be voting on these changes at our Lodge Meeting.

Below are the proposed changes to the AEA Bylaws. Deleted text is indicated in red and is struck out in red and the added text is indicated with red text.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

Section 1 - Appointment of Committees.

Currently reads

d. Articles and By-Laws Advisory Committee of at least five (5) but no more than seven (7) members to review and make recommendations to the Governing Body concerning the Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws and Rules and Regulations of the Association. The committee shall also give to Association officials such counsel and advice as may be requested or as deemed necessary for the good of the Association. Membership on the committee shall be limited to

Past Presidents of the Association in good standing in their own Lodges.

Change to read

d. Articles and By-Laws Advisory Committee of at least five (5) but no more than seven (7) members to review and make recommendations to the Governing Body concerning the Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws and Rules and Regulations of the Association. The committee shall also give ~~to~~ Association officials such counsel and advice as may be requested or as deemed necessary for the good of the Association. Membership on the committee shall be limited to ~~Past Presidents-1st Vice President Eligible members~~ of the Association in good standing in their own Lodges ~~with recommendation from a Past President~~.

Discussion

There are not enough Past State Presidents to fill the committees with the requirement to be a Past State President. This will allow PERs who have been a Vice President and DDGER and above to fill a void which could become an issue with Past president oversight.



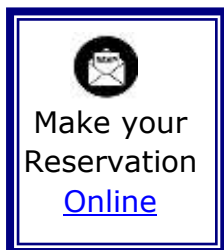

YOUTH ACTIVITIES

Pinal County 4-H Shooting Competition

On Saturday, March 9th we hosted this Pinal County 4-H competition in the Lodge. 5 Elks & 12 non-elks assisted with the event that saw 8 girls and boys compete for the championship air rifle title and air pistol championship title.



The event began at noon and ended at 5:30 pm. They used our hot dog roller cooker to feed their attendees by them providing their own food. Elk member Derek Hulsebus is the contact as organizer.



FACILITIES

Well Repairs

Water in the Arizona Desert is essential. Our Elks Lodge has well number 55-212698 that was drilled 8/5/2006 and is located near the north east corner of our property. It is 400 feet deep in the Gila River aquifer.

Last summer we replaced the casing that was nearly ready to fail. At that time the 3 H.P. Submersible pump tested out as working but on Wednesday night 3/26/2025 it failed. This emergency was repair was authorized by the Board of Directors and thanks to Lodge member Dan Macy, we were able to replace the pump Friday morning.

As Stephan Hotz, Mark Blackwell, Chad Knutson and Bob Beck began the process of cleaning the Black storage tank, which took until end of day Saturday, it was discovered that defective pressure tank at the well site required replacing – it was also discovered to be the home of 2 very large gopher snakes misidentified as rattle snakes!
