



MEET: Tom Johnson



This month, we are proud to honor Tom Johnson as our Volunteer of the Month—a man whose generosity, creativity, and commitment to community are truly inspiring.

Tom hails from Pinos Altos, New Mexico—a picturesque place whose name translates to *Tall Pines*—but his roots go back to Whitefish Bay, Wisconsin, where he spent his childhood and graduated from high school. His journey has taken him through Wellesley, Mississippi, where he lived for five years, Massachusetts, and eventually to Arizona, where he moved in 1973 to attend Arizona State University. There, he earned a degree in design and architecture, setting the stage for a lifetime of creative work and community involvement.

Tom and his wife Nancy—married since 2002—made Anthem their part-time home, a peaceful retreat from their busy lives managing The


