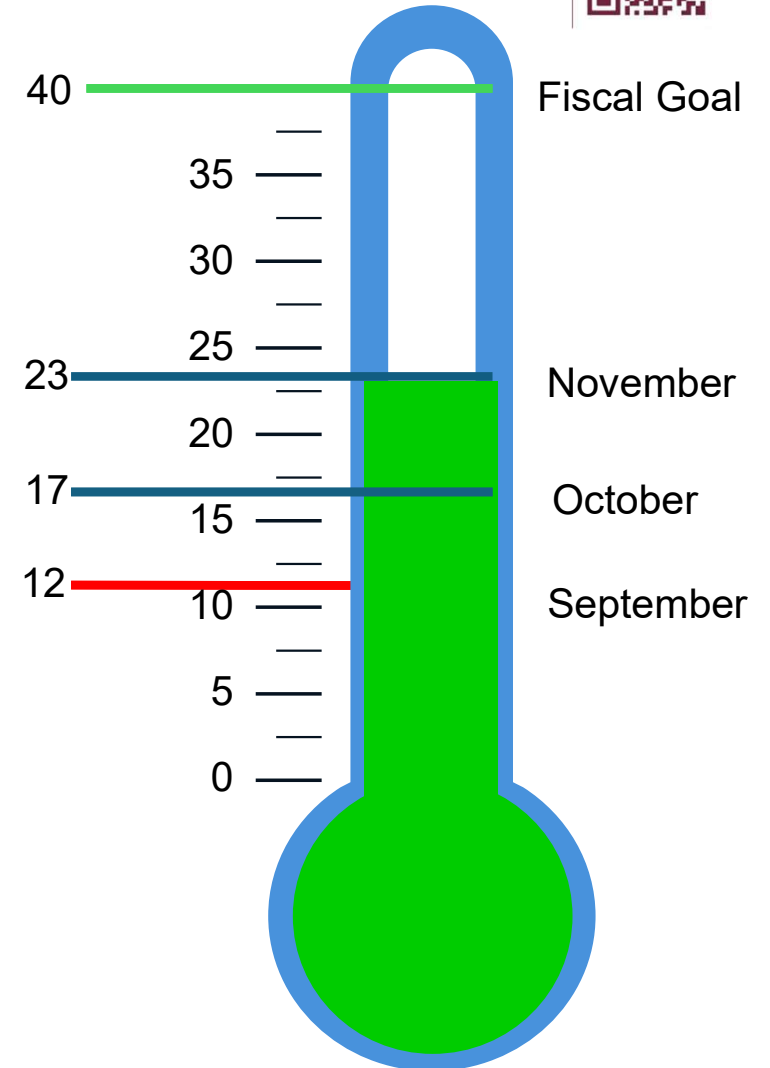

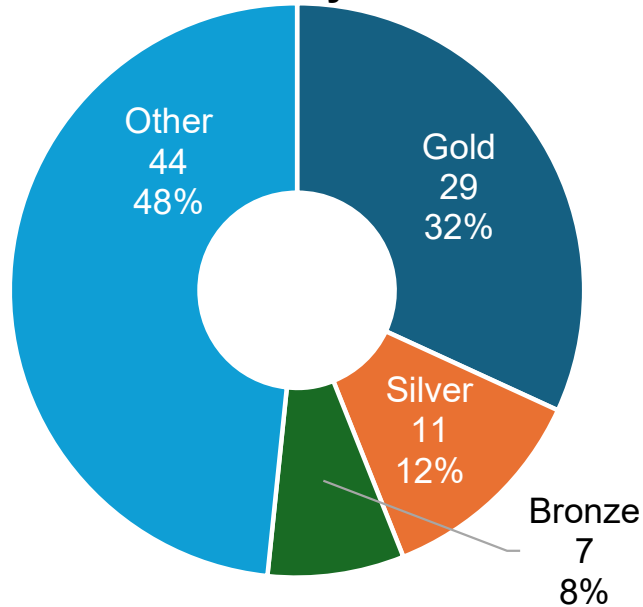

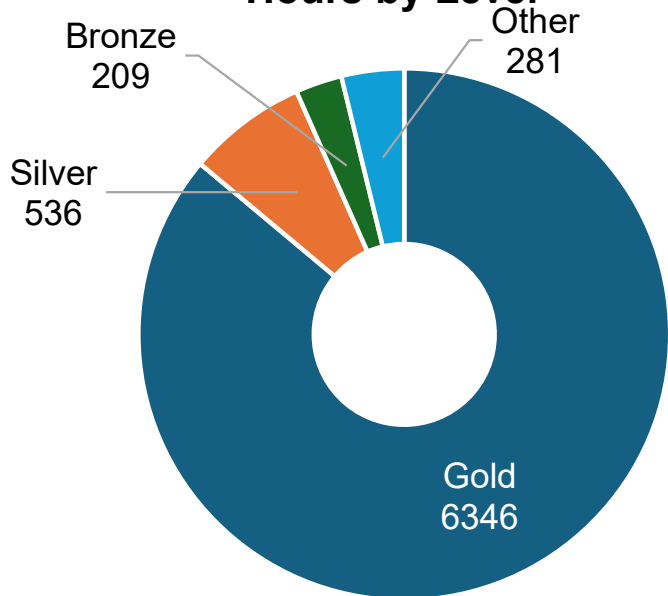


Volunteer Appreciation as of 10/31
