Spotlight Grant \$2,000



As part of our Spotlight Grant project, Coolidge-Florence Elks Lodge delivered \$2,000 worth of food to the Christ the Victor Food Pantry to help support local families in need on 8/13/2025.

Every Tuesday and Thursday, the Food Bank works with volunteers and TEFAP program to distribute pre-packed boxes and bags. Gratitude Grant

Each school received the following items:

30 yellow highlighters

12 boxes of colored pencils (12 count boxes)

1 box of 40 Dry-erase markers





The 9 Elementary Schools (2-Coolidge and 7-Florence) were also presented with 16 Spanish to English Dictionaries each for the Elk's Dictionary Project.

During the meetings, we presented the principals with information about the Drug Awareness Poster, Essay, and Video Contest. In addition, we provided the high school principals in Florence with details on the Most Valuable Student Scholarship and Legacy Award opportunities.







ELIGIBILITY

- Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.
- Applicants **do not** need to be related to a member of the Elks.
- High school graduates are not eligible to apply.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are submitted; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.
- Scholarships are available only to students who enroll in four-year undergraduate degree programs at accredited U.S. American colleges or universities.

AWARDS

- The Elks National Foundation will award 500 fouryear scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the 2026 competition.
- Male and female students compete separately.
- Ranging from \$1,000 per year to \$7,500 per year,
 Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students
 pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis
 (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college
 or university. All scholarships are in the form of certificates of award conditional upon the full-time enrollment of the winner in an accredited U.S. college
 or university.

Every Top 20 MVS scholar will receive a \$30,000 scholarship and an invitation to the MVS Leadership weekend in Chicago, April 30—May 3, 2026

ELIGIBILITY

- Any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2023, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2023, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member for the last two contiguous years through March 31, 2026. Great-grandchildren are not eligible. Applicants **do not** need to be related to a member of the Elks.
- The applicant must be a high school senior.
- If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must select the parent's Elks Lodge on the application.
- We have waived the standardized test requirement for the 2026 Legacy contest. You do not need to submit ACT and/or SAT scores.
- Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student wins more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.
- Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities.
- 2026 Legacy Awards recipient, to further strengthen your connection to the #ElksFamily, you must complete an act of service with a Lodge at least three times during your collegiate career. Click here for more information about serving with the Elks.
