As a new school year begins, I wanted to remind everyone of the Elks Most Valuable Student Scholarship. This scholarship is open to all high school seniors within the US who are American citizens. Those are the only two qualifications for this award. Applicants do not necessarily have to be related to an Elks member.

If you know of a student who is going to be a senior in high school this fall, I would ask that you encourage them to apply for this scholarship. Each year, the Elks give out over \$3 Million in scholarships on the national level, in addition to awards on the local level. Just last year, a graduating student from Scotia was awarded \$10,000 from the Elks National Foundation and she received that because she applied for the Elks Most Valuable Student Scholarship

The deadline to apply for this scholarship is November 12th. Again, I would encourage all graduating seniors to apply for this scholarship. Full details on the scholarship provided by the Grand Lodge are below. If students have any questions at all regarding this scholarship, I would have them reach out to their guidance counselor or they can feel free to contact me directly as well.

Our scholarship programs are for undergraduate study only. A student may not receive more than one Elks National Foundation scholarship award or grant in any one academic year.

The scholarships awards (except Emergency Education Grants) are evidenced by a Certificate of Award issued by the Chicago office of the Elks National Foundation. All checks are paid directly to the school; under no circumstance can we make payment directly to the student.

Scholarship awards may be used for cost of attendance expenses. In order to receive payment, a student must have the school send to our Chicago office, the completed Verification of Enrollment form, whereupon, we will issue our check, payable to the school, and mail it directly to the school to establish a credit in the name of the student. We will notify the student when we mail the check.

Since most checks are being prepared during the months of August through November, student and school must allow four to six weeks for payment.

If a student terminates his or her courses for any reason, the undisbursed balance of the award MUST be returned directly to the Foundation's Chicago office. It may NOT be transferred to another school, and it may NOT be paid to the student personally.

It is the responsibility of the student to follow up on all matters relating to his or her scholarship award.

In all correspondence relating to a student who has been awarded a scholarship, we must have the full name and the ENF ID of the student.

The information herein should not be turned over to publishers or those who wish to include it in a computer resource listing. We receive hundreds of requests from students who pay for scholarship/grant information, only to find they are not eligible or that the information is years out-of-date. Unfortunately, many of these sources do not publish complete information, nor do they update their files on a regular basis.

The Elks National Foundation has no loan programs, vocational grants or assistance for graduate study available, and it does not maintain a mailing list.

If a student would like to use his or her scholarship funds for a study abroad program, it must be billed through an accredited, U.S. degree-granting institution. We cannot issue funds to a third party program or vendor.

The Elks National Foundation reserves the right to cancel an award in total, if we do not hear from a student for two consecutive academic years.

The 2026 Most Valuable Student application closes on November 12, 2025 at 11:59 p.m. Pacific Time.

Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need.

If prompted, the program code is: ElksMVS

Eligibility:

Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.

Applicants do not need to be related to a member of the Elks.

High school graduates are not eligible to apply.

Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are submitted; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.

Scholarships are available only to students who enroll in four-year undergraduate degree programs at accredited U.S. American colleges or universities.

<u>Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships</u> available to children and grandchildren of Elks members. Eligibility requirements are outlined below.

Application deadline is February 2, 2026, 11:59 a.m. Pacific Time. NOTE: This is NOON, mid-day, Pacific time.

Read below for eligibility information and answers to Frequently Asked Questions.

Who is Eligible?

For the 2026 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2023, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2023, is eligible to apply. The Elk must have paid Lodge dues for the last two contiguous years through March 31, 2026. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.

The applicant must be a high school senior.

The applicant must apply online only. The 2026 Legacy Awards application deadline is February 2, 2026, 11:59 a.m. Pacific Time. NOTE: This is NOON, mid-day, Pacific time.

If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must select the parent's Elks Lodge on the application.

We have waived the standardized test requirement for the 2026 Legacy contest. You do not need to submit ACT and/or SAT scores.

Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student wins more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.

Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities. (Note: Applicants from Panama, Puerto Rico and the Philippines may apply Legacy Awards toward schools, colleges or universities in their respective homes.)

If you are selected as a 2026 Legacy Awards recipient, to further strengthen your connection to the #ElksFamily, you must complete an act of service with a Lodge at least three times during your collegiate career. Click here for more information about serving with the Elks.

The 2026 Legacy Awards Contest Opened September 1.

The student must complete and submit the ONLINE application. The 2026 Legacy Awards application opens on September 1, 2025 and the deadline is February 2, 2026 at 11:59 a.m. Pacific Time.

The Elk sponsor's membership will be verified through the BPOE Grand Lodge headquarters.

When a student registers to complete the online application, both the applicant and Lodge Secretary will be notified by email.

If you have questions about your online Legacy Awards application, contact the ENF Scholarship Office via email at scholarship@elks.org.

Upon receipt of the application, the applicant will receive a notification that the application was received. Winners will be announced in late April 2026.

Note: Because the contest begins in one Lodge year and the winners are announced in the next, a Legacy Award could go to the child or grandchild of a lapsed member. An applicant's Elk parent or grandparent must be a paid-up member in good standing at the time of application, but if the Elk chooses not to renew membership, that decision will not affect the outcome of the Legacy Awards contest.
