The District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler, or DDGER, is the district representative for the Grand Lodge of the Elks. The DDGER ensures that the local lodges adhere to the Grand Lodge statutes and programs.

Responsibilities of the DDGER include:

- Conducting annual audits of local lodges to verify compliance with Grand Lodge statutes and programming.
- Reviewing comments from the Grand Lodge Auditing & Accounting Committee and ensuring that annual financial concerns are addressed.
- Monitoring the CLMS2Web Lodge Status Report to ensure membership updates are filed twice a month.
- Monitoring the local lodges' contributions to the Elks National Foundation monthly.
- Verifying submissions to the Lodge Charity Reports on the 15th and 30th of each month.
- Submitting reports of visits to lodges within one week of each visit.
- Recording the date the visitation report is mailed on the District Deputy's Check Sheet.
- Making special assignments or conducting second visits to lodges when required by the Past Grand Exalted Ruler(s) of their area.
- Being furnished with blanks and other data by the Grand Secretary, filling them out carefully, and transmitting them immediately after a Lodge's institution.
- Sending a numerical list of all zip codes in the jurisdiction of a new Lodge with the report of Institution.

In essence, the DDGER acts as a liaison between the Grand Lodge and the individual lodges within their district, ensuring that the Elks' mission and operational procedures are consistently upheld across all levels.

### The First 3 Resolutions Failed

### SUMMARY OF RESOLUTIONS

**Resolution 2025-01:** To make participation in the physical loss and crime coverage policy procured by Grand Lodge optional for Local Lodges and to require proof of alternative insurance coverage.

**Resolution 2025-02:** To allow a Lodge to satisfy the bond requirement for the Lodge Secretary through an outside insurance company.

**Resolution 2025-03:** To allow a Lodge to satisfy the bond requirement for the Lodge Treasurer through an outside insurance company.

**Resolution 2025-04:** To authorize the issuance of electronic membership cards, allow the Office of the Grand Secretary to determine requirements, and require Local Lodges to recognize an electronic membership card in the same manner as paper cards.

Resolution 2025-05: To define what constitutes a Lodge Affiliate.

**Resolution 2025-06:** To clarify the suspension of the social privileges of a member applies to all social functions and social activities of the Order.

**Resolution 2025-07:** To clarify, if a Local Lodge adds the Secretary and Treasurer to the Board of Directors, the Lodge must ensure such action is consistent with its corporate documents.
