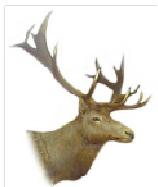

Elks National Foundation and Grants

ENF update

We will continue to keep all updated about our ENF donations for the year. Your donation helps us to provide services to youth and those in need. Because of our lodge generosity, we were able to obtain an extra \$500 in grants for the 2024-2025 year. Thank you! Watch for 50-50 and other raffles over the year to help us reach our per capita goals. Our recent 50-50 at the PER dinner gave us an additional \$80 toward that goal. If you don't have the ability to participate in our lodge fundraisers, consider using the on line donation option and join the Fidelity Club. It is easy and you can join for just \$5 a month. Please see attached documents to learn how. If we get additional members to join the Fidelity club, we are eligible for an additional \$500 bonus for next year.

Grants update

We were awarded a \$1000 Freedom Grant to assist local children of those serving at the 109th Airlift wing at the Stratton Air National Guard Base. This was an identified need last year and the Family Resource Coordinator asked for our help again this year for school backpacks and supplies.

Beacon and Spotlight Grants are our renewal grant to assist with food insecurity among out local families in need and includes the Weekend School Backpack and the Community meal

programs at the City Mission.

Gratitude Grant - Application is pending but will include the Dictionary Project and other lodge programs to assist those in need especially at holiday time.

Major Projects Update

Our Lodge finished the year with over \$10 per Capita. Recently the District PER association added an additional \$2.25 per member to each lodge in our district. Please continue to support our district fundraisers.

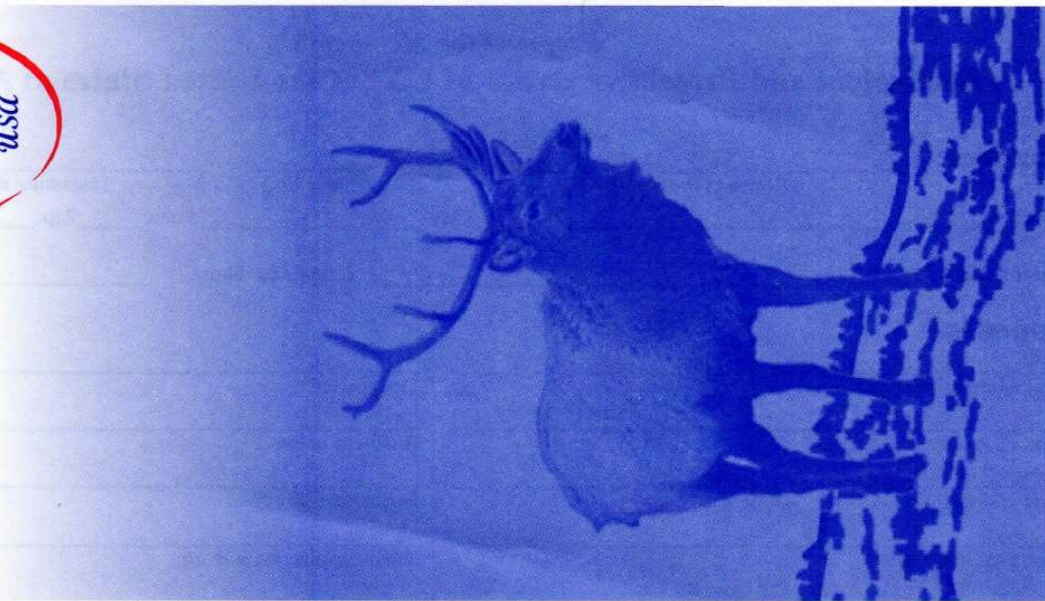

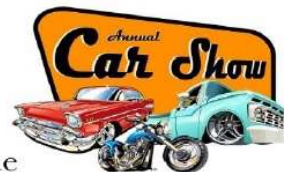
