Elks National Foundation and Grants

ENF Grant update

All of our 2024-25 grant projects were completed and final reports accepted. We have already been able to secure a Freedom Grant in the amount of \$1000. The grant will be used to support the 109th Airlift Wing for their Family day. They have hundreds of active military deployed and this was identified as an area of greatest need.

There are many members of our local base who would benefit from this event which promotes camaraderie among the active military and their families. They currently have active members deployed to Antarctica, Greenland, New Zealand, Jordan, Africa, Kuwait and Qatar. In addition, they have over 200 members who are staffing NYS prisons due to recent labor issues and firings of prison guards. Often when those who serve are deployed, they are gone from their families for 6 months or more.

In addition to the donation of grant funds, I am hoping we can support their program with donations of water, soda and snacks. I will be asking for those individual donations later during the summer. I hope many of you

will consider a small donation of the items requested.

As for the other grants it is recommended to wait until

final numbers are calculated before applying for the Gratitude grant and our Beacon grant is our renewable grant that assists the City Mission of Schenectady with feeding our local residents and children.

ENF fundraising

If anyone is so inclined, the ENF donations are open for 2025-26 Elk year and many of you have made a contribution with your dues. You can also sign up for the Fidelity club at any time and if we secure additional contributors, we can be eligible for additional grant funds. You can sign up for as little as \$5 per month or make a one time donation on line. Please ask me for any assistance with this.

Thank you for your generosity in supporting our ENF fundraising campaigns.

Major Projects

Our NYS Major Project supports the Cerebral Palsy Home Services program. It is a program that many families with a disabled child cannot survive without.




